### ISSUES WHICH I AM CURRENTLY WORKING ON IN THE RATHFARNHAM AREA

I am delighted to have met with many residents across the Rathfarnham ward over the last number of months and to have received their feedback on issues and developments in their localities.

Some of the issues which I am currently working on include:

#### Impact of the Ballyboden Primary Care Centre Development on Local Residents

I have been engaging and consulting with local residents particularly in Moyville Estate, Whitechurch Estate, Boden Park, Taylors Lane and Prospect Manor on the impact of the construction of a new primary care facility at Taylors Lane, Ballyboden on the local residents in the area. The development of a primary care centre for

the Rathfarnham area is a welcome initiative yet the impact on the local residents in terms of security, traffic and congestion, loss of local amenities such as the pitch and putt club at the planned site must not be overlooked. I have been contacted by many residents from the Whitechurch, Glenmore and Grangebrook estates recently in relation to the proposed playspace in Whitechurch estate. I am continuing to work in the area to ensure that there is an appropriate forum provided in the coming weeks for residents to voice their views and concerns on the development.
